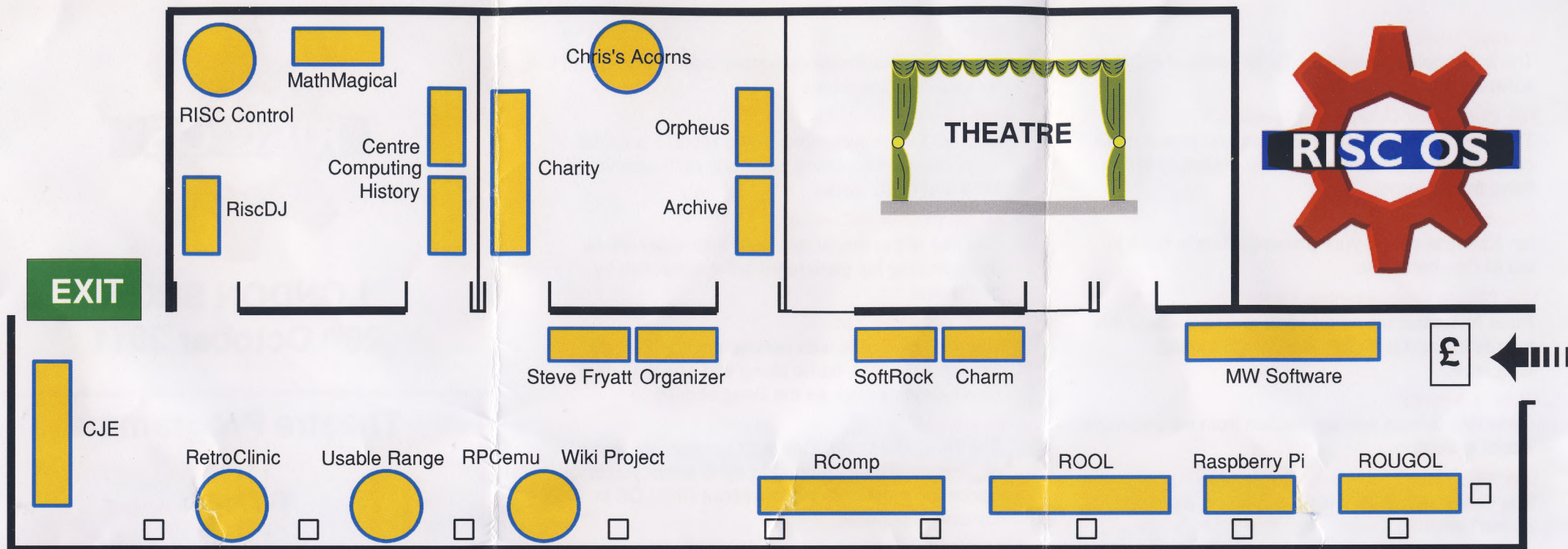

Combat Stress is the leading UK charity specialising in the care of British ex-Service men and women's mental health.

Many of the Veterans who turn to the charity have been profoundly traumatised by harrowing experiences during their Service career and suffer from debilitating conditions such as Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), depression and anxiety disorders.

Combat Stress has three short-stay specialist treatment centres (in Surrey, Shropshire and Ayrshire), as well as a

nationwide community outreach service that provides support to Veterans in their local area. Demand for our unique services continues to rise - in the last year alone we have received 1,400 new referrals seeking our help. The charity is currently caring for 4,600 Veterans, including over 670 from the operations in Iraq and Afghanistan. On average it takes 13 years for Veterans to come to us for help.

Founded in 1919, **Combat Stress** has helped over 100,000 psychologically wounded Veterans. The support we receive in donations is vital to the help we can offer a particularly needful, but often overlooked, group of Veterans as they rebuild their lives.

ROUGOL is a not-for-profit organisation consisting of RISC OS users in London and the south-east. After its formation in September 1999, the group grew rapidly with membership exceeding 100 by early 2000.

We meet on the 3rd Monday of every month in a private room at The Blue Eyed Maid, Borough High Street. SE1 1HR, which serves good curries and is about 5 minutes walk from London Bridge Station. Free wifi is usually available.
